ABOUT PERU

Peru has one of the highest infant mortality rates in Latin America, and struggles to fight tuberculosis, malaria and many fishing-related illnesses. The under-funded and understaffed medical system contributes to problems in Peru. The country is in need of medical assistance and education that can be provided by the PROJECT C.U.R.E. team.

ABOUT THE CLINIC SITES

The team will work at two sites in Lima, the capitol city, and Pucusana, a small coastal village south of Lima. The PROJECT C.U.R.E. medical team successfully set up a health clinic treating a multitude of patients in 2009. The clinic experience will include health fairs, education days, and training and working with local staff. There is significant need for doctors and nurses in the field of obstetrics, pediatrics, trauma and cardiology.
