ABOUT TANZANIA

Tanzania, a country of rich culture and landmarks in southeastern Africa, has a population of 38 million people. Dar es Salaam, meaning “Abode of Peace,” was once the capital city (Dodoma currently is), but still remains the economic capital and most populated city in the country.

ABOUT THE C.U.R.E. CLINICS TRIP

The majority of the Tanzanian population resides in rural areas where one hospital often serves upwards of 350,000 people. Mtinko is approximately 150 miles southwest of Arusha. The medical team will work in the Carolus Hospital and a nearby dispensary to administer patient care. The ratio of doctor to patient is 1:20,000. The predominant diseases and illness are anemia, respiratory, skin diseases, eye infections and intestinal disorders. The focus of this hospital is on maternal and child health. The medical team will bring medications to assist the staff at Carolus Hospital.

WE NEED YOU!

Despite the beauty of the country, the people of Tanzania are in great need of your help through medical attention. More than half of the world's population lives below the poverty line, without access to even the most basic healthcare. More than 11 million children die each year. Most of these deaths are preventable.

The country has one of Africa’s most glorious attractions and the highest peak on the continent, Mount Kilimanjaro. The spectacular Ngorogoro Conservation Park provides a scenic outlet for travelers, as does the neighboring Serengeti National Park.



Costs of this C.U.R.E. CLINICS trip are \$3,500. Safari trip extensions to the Serengeti can be arranged at an additional cost.
