ABOUT HAITI

Filled with tropical fruits and lush mountainous regions, Haiti first became known as “La Perle des Antilles,” or “the pearl of the Caribbean.” What was once France’s richest colony is considered today to be the poorest nation in the Western Hemisphere. Located just west of the Dominican



Republic on the island of Hispaniola in the Caribbean Sea, Haiti is made up of over 9 million French and Creole speaking inhabitants. Crippled by political instability, environmental damage, and social violence, Haiti has struggled throughout its history to reestablish its once bright potential. Behind the dark shadow of this nation’s reputation lies a rich culture of music, dancing, and art, as well as a vibrant population hopeful for change.

ABOUT THE CLINIC

Cap-Haitien, a city of 180,000 residents on the northern coast of the island, is considered one of the safest areas in Haiti. The team will assist Open Door Medical Clinic located several miles outside of Cap-Haitien. Haiti has high infant and maternal mortality, malnutrition, and an HIV/AIDS rate that continues to escalate. Due to extreme poverty and the overwhelming failures of the public health system, many Haitians lack even the most basic healthcare. Common illnesses found in Haiti are tuberculosis, meningitis, malaria and HIV/AIDS.
